SACRAMENTAL AND PARISH INFORMATION

New Members

Welcome to Saint Francis Parish. Please call the Parish Center Office in order to register in our parish, or stop in during office hours or on the weekend after all Masses. One needs to be a member of our parish three months in order to receive a certificate of eligibility. Please notify the office if you change your address or move away.

Religious Education (PREP)

All children of the parish should be receiving religious instruction through our parish school or through our Parish Religious Education Program offered on a Sunday morning from 9:00 to 10:15 AM. Please contact Mrs. Camille Stockdale, our Director of Religious Education, for more information regarding our PREP (610-435-0364).

Marriage

We look forward to celebrating God's gift of love in the sacrament of marriage for any registered and practicing parishioner. Diocesan policy states that contact should be made one year, but no later than six months, prior to the proposed date of marriage in order to begin pre-nuptial instructions. Call the Parish Center Office for further information.

Baptisms

Baptisms are held for our registered and practicing parishioners normally the first Sunday of the month immediately after the 10:30 Mass. Parents are to register for a Baptismal Preparation Class held normally on the Wednesday before each baptism in the Parish Center. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic for the valid reception of baptism. That person must also be able to receive a certificate of eligibility from their Catholic parish. A Non-Catholic Christian is permitted to act as a witness. Parents should begin to make arrangements for a baptism during pregnancy.

Ministry to the Sick

Visits to the hospital are made on a regular basis. Please notify the Parish Center Office when a parishioner is in the hospital or home and would like to receive communion or the anointing of the sick. Visits can also be made to those parishioners who are homebound and would like to receive communion.

We encourage all our parents to consider sending their children to our parish school, Saint John Vianney Regional School. Our school is located at 210 North 18th Street in Allentown. Please contact our school principal, Dr. Emily Kleintop (610-435-8981), to register your child for a faith based, middle-states accredited, Catholic education.

October: The Month of the Holy Rosary and of the Blessed Virgin Mary

“O Queen of the Holy Rosary, O bless us as we pray.”

Every October, we pray the rosary together before every Mass and we sing a plethora of Marian hymns, praising our dear Blessed Mother for her faith-filled, model life she lived. Throughout the month, we'll examine some of these prayers, names, and hymns - focusing on where they have come from in the tradition of the Church.



WHERE DID THE ROSARY COME FROM?

There is no extra-liturgical prayer that is more widely recited than the Holy Rosary. It has been held in high esteem throughout the history of the Church as there is a completeness to it. Stemming from medieval times, the rosary began as a substitute for the Liturgy of the Hours. It is a Marian prayer where the Hail Mary is repeated in sets of decades, followed by the Our Father and Glory Be, and is accompanied by mysteries that focus on the Incarnation of, the sufferings of, and the glorification of Jesus Christ.

It has long been popular with our Holy Fathers. Saint [Pope] John Paul II wrote during his tenure as our Supreme Pontiff: “The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer... it has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety...It is an echo of the prayer of Mary, her perennial Magnificat for the work of the redemptive Incarnation which began in her virginal womb. With the Rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer.” (*Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, #2) In the rosary, we not only see the face of Christ or walk through the lives of Jesus and Mary, but we remember Christ and the history of salvation with Mary. In this contemplative prayer, as we focus on the mysteries set before us, we are reminded that Mary, our Mother, is joined with Christ. She is exalted because of her union with Jesus, her Son, because she truly is the Mother of God.
